

"And it also had to be a secure




community, which was important to me."



Expert tips to improve gut health

> "Your gut bacteria, or gut microbiome, is a community of trillions of bacteria living in your large intestine which release beneficial substances into your bloodstream that are vital to your health and wellbeing," Carly explained.

"Most people are surprised to learn that their bloated stomach may be a result of their gut bacteria."

Like a fingerprint, each person's microbiota (mix of bacteria) is unique and originally determined by their DNA but is also influenced by diet and lifestyle.

Carly described the process of how

eating plant foods helps to feed our good gut bacteria.

"When you eat plant foods, your body can't break down the part called 'fibre' so this is where your gut bacteria take over. When your gut bacteria digest this fibre, they produce beneficial fatty acids which are distributed to every part of your body through your blood," she said.

"One of the favourable fatty acids is butyrate, which enhances your health in many ways."

Butyrate helps to improve your gut health by boosting your body's immune defence system, regulating your blood



Simple tips to promote good gut bacteria

- 1. Eat a variety of plant foods aim for 30 different plant foods per week including vegetables, fruits, nuts and seeds.
- 2. Add some prebiotic-rich foods to your breakfast such as combining asparagus with eggs or chopped onion and garlic with tomatoes.
- 3. Eat yoghurt filled with beneficial probiotics look for the words 'live active cultures' or 'lactobacillus' which are friendly bacteria and choose a brand with low sugar and high protein for added health benefits.

"When we eat a diet rich in probiotics, such as yoghurt or fermented foods like kombucha, we are supplying our body with healthy bacteria," said Carly.

"Think of prebiotics as the soil that will help the bacteria survive. Without a fuel source, the good bacteria will simply move on and won't colonise the gut. Prebiotics are found in high-fibre foods such as onion, garlic, leeks, asparagus and the supplement inulin.

"Probiotics and prebiotics both work together to make the beneficial butyrate."

Start the new year right by planning a great Australian roadtrip! To get you inspired, we take a look at some of the iconic places to see and experience, including terrific day trips that are just a few hours from home.

Tasmania

Escape the heat and head south for the summer. Tasmania, the beautiful apple isle, is rich in charm and local history. And being geographically compact, you can pack in a lot of holiday in not a lot of miles.

The only argument to be settled is when is the best time to go. There are some who maintain summer is the best season where the maximum never gets over 25°C, while others advocate for autumn when the leaves turn vivid colours and the fresh Pacific oysters are at their best. Or rug up and experience a bracing winter fuelled by a dram of local whisky, tasty truffles and scallops.

In honour of the four seasons, we've chosen our favourite activities from the very best Tasmania has to offer.

The Aurora Australis the Southern Lights June to November

The shimmering, ethereal phenomenon, is caused by charged particles from the sun being drawn to the Earth's poles. Tasmania is a great place to catch a glimpse of the Aurora Australis. 





Delicious low-calorie salad

Prawn and Soba Noodle Salad

Kickstart your new year diet with this nutritious and satisfying salad!

Who said salads are boring? You'll be coming back for seconds once you try the talented Chef Matt Conquest's fusion seafood salad that will keep your weight down but your spirits high this summer.

Ingredients

Serves 4

Prawns:

1kg large green king prawns, peeled and de-veined
2 tbsp mixed (black and white) sesame seeds
1 garlic clove, finely grated
Lime zest
1 tbsp sesame oil or olive oil
Salt and pepper to taste

Salad:

1 pack soba noodles 2 Lebanese cucumbers, halved and then cut into angled slices 1 red onion (100g), sliced thinly 1 fresh long red chilli, seeded and sliced thinly 1 bunch asparagus, cut into spears and blanched ½ cup mint, picked and torn ½ cup fresh coriander, coarsely chopped

Dressing:

2 tbsp light soy sauce2 tsp fish sauce2 tsp grated palm sugar2 tbsp lime juice1 tbsp rice wine vinegar



Method

- 1. Mix all the marinade ingredients and pour them over the prawns (you can choose to skewer the prawns or leave them as is).
- 2. Sear the prawns in a hot pan with a dash of oil and cook until lightly browned. Alternatively, fire up the barbecue and grill the prawns over high heat until done.
- 3. Combine the ingredients for the dressing in a salad bowl.
- 4. Cook the soba noodles in salted water for 3-4 minutes. Drain and rinse with cold water and toss into the dressing, along with the other salad ingredients.
- 5. Plate up the salad and top it off with the prawns. Grill a couple of cheeks of lemon or lime to serve if desired.
