Downsizing on a larger scale

Downsizing from a large property to an over-50s lifestyle resort can be a daunting task, but if armed with the right tools, knowledge and a plan of attack, your move will be successful and a positive experience.

Tina and Dean Austin from Amber at Living Gems recently returned from a holiday in Vietnam where they spent a lot of time reflecting on their decision to sell their large family home and move into an over-50s lifestyle community.

"Dean and I had met while serving in the Defence Force where we saw operational service in war zones," Tina tells us. "After much thought and deliberation, we decided to look into making the move from our much-loved home to a new lifestyle."

Retirement and travel were high on their list as well as security and being able to leave their home for extended periods, so they shopped around and weighed up the options before making their final decision.

They chose a lifestyle resort over a retirement village, as it offered much better "value for money". And because it was important for them



to choose a resort that suited their way of life, the Austins began visiting lifestyle resorts from the Gold Coast to Hervey Bay.

"There were some beautiful resorts to choose from. We started doing the numbers and considered our existing rates, the cost to maintain the swimming pool and spa, the cost of mowing our half acre of lawn versus the weekly fees we were looking at," says Dean.

The figures showed it would cost the couple an extra \$30 a week to live in an over-50s resort, but the huge array of facilities available, including high-quality social, sports and recreational amenities, meant better value for money with the weekly site fees providing a comprehensive and complete suite of offerings.

"For that small additional cost, we would live in a beautiful new home within a secure gated community.

Then there was the huge array of first-class amenities for us to enjoy like a heated mineral pool, lawn bowls rink, indoor ten-pin bowling, pickleball court, billiards, darts, library, movie cinema, stage for shows, cafe, and outdoor vegetable garden, plus the bar would always be a drawcard for many functions and happy hours."

Some retirement villages also have stamp duty on the properties if the village is under a strata, community, or freehold title. In addition, they would also take up to 50 percent capital gains and deferred management fees if Tina and Dean ever decided to sell up. It was not the option they wanted to go with. As a result, they chose Amber at Living Gems.

Security was also high on their agenda, and giving them the ability to lock up and leave enabled the

couple to enjoy their passion for overseas travel and have good friends keep an eye on things while exploring the world.

"Living in a gated community with residents our own age has helped us meet so many new friends and enjoy activities inside our resort, as well as external outings including overseas travel together," Tina says. "We have Woolworths, doctors' surgeries, a chemist, bakery, hotel, and other amenities only 200 metres from our resort gate."

The bus service to the Loganlea railway station where express trains run to Brisbane, the airport and the Gold Coast, and the Logan Hospital are other drawcards the couple absolutely love, as the amenities are all within a 15-minute drive.

"Living in this resort is the best move we have ever made. We just love the friendships and lifestyle."

Downsizing dilemma

Packing a lifetime of memories with no regrets

After 41 years living on a 57-acre property in the Lockyer Valley and amassing a huge treasure trove of possessions along the way, the thought of downsizing was somewhat daunting for Living Gems Toowoomba homeowners Colleen and Jeffrey Otto.

"It was such a big move and took us a while to get our heads around it, but there was a lot of work involved in staying on the land. We eventually decided it was in our best interests, and I can tell you we have not regretted our decision for a moment to downsize and move to this beautiful over-50s lifestyle resort," said Colleen.

The couple, who have two sons and four grandchildren, said they had the full support of their family who helped them sort through everything and decide what would go to charity, what could be kept or stored, and what to throw out.

"We had to get rid of a lot of stuff and we had some really good crockery and furniture we put into storage on our son's property, but were so blessed to have the help of our boys throughout it all. Surprisingly, the house sold within two weeks and we saw that as a sign that we were making the right decision."

Jeffrey and Colleen said they took very little with them when they moved into their new home at Living Gems Toowoomba, but were pleasantly surprised at just how much space their new home offered.

"I am actually going to get some of our things out of storage now. It fits everything including our six-seater dining room suite, two queen beds, and a big three-seater lounge, plus two single armchairs. "Downsizing was never an issue for us because we found the resort homes, including this one, so spacious that we made very few compromises. We also have a beautiful rural outlook over trees and a big paddock," said Joy.





Home sweet home

Balancing the books on downsizing

The family home is typically the most valuable asset you own, and there are a few factors to consider before downsizing. If you are newly retired, or over 50 and still working, you might be looking at either a retirement village or an over-50s lifestyle resort for your 'rightsizing' move.

According to finance expert Rachel Lane author of *Downsizing Made Simple* with Noel Whittaker, understanding the difference between a retirement village and over-50s resort is vital.

"There are currently five types of retirement village contracts - leasehold, license, company or unit trust title, strata title and rental - while land lease communities have only two separate components, which include the contract for your home and contract for your land," she says.

Cheryl Chalk, who lives at Amber by Living Gems agrees. Now retired, the former accountant made the

decision to move into a Living Gems resort after careful consideration.

"I was familiar with the land lease community model because my parents-in-law lived in one," she said.

"So, when it came time to consider my own move, I knew the type of resort I was looking for.

"One of the things which was important to me was knowing that all of the capital gains in my home were mine. I didn't think that sharing capital gains with a retirement village was particularly fair since it is my home."

To better understand the difference between a land lease community

model like Living Gems and a typical retirement village, we've created a handy table for a quick reference (see above).

Cheryl recommends looking at your financial position and ensuring that you have a healthy cash reserve when you sell your present home.

"Of course, when you move into a land lease resort like Living Gems, there is the weekly site fee to keep in mind. Make sure you have enough cash in reserve for that as well as your utilities and lifestyle," she said.

"Other considerations are that there is no stamp duty payable on the purchase of resort homes and that people on a government pension may be eligible for some rent assistance to help cover the weekly site rental."

In the end, each person needs to be satisfied that the decision is right for them, she advised.

"For me, there were other factors that tipped my decision in favour of Living Gems, and they were not financial in nature," said Cheryl.

"Those factors included living in a location that was relatively close to family and being near to shops and services, as well having a great range of facilities and a welcoming community."

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Are you doing these downsizing don'ts?

Top ten mistakes people make when shifting to community living



Planning to rightsize requires careful thought. If you know anyone who is considering moving into an over-50s lifestyle resort, make sure they read this handy list of the top ten typical mistakes people make.

1. Making a hasty decision

When deciding what to do about the family home, you might find yourself hemmed in on all sides by well-meaning advice from family and friends.

It's a significant step and if you've lived in your home for a long time, there are many precious memories there too – along with everything that's familiar, such as the neighbours and the neighbourhood.

You might feel under pressure from your family to sell the home or be urged by a spouse to downsize.

As a result, you could feel obliged to make a quick decision to make everyone happy.

This is a mistake that could be financially costly as well as negatively impact on your future wellbeing and peace of mind.



Once you have decided that downsizing is the right decision for you, take your time to look around. Not all options are created equal. Understand all the choices available and don't feel under pressure from salespeople, especially if you're not ready to move.

2. Assuming you know the differences between land lease communities, retirement villages and strata living

When looking around at downsizing options, many people think their only choices are a retirement village or an apartment.

But there is another option, one designed for over-50s who are still leading active lives and want to maximise social and financial opportunities.

A land lease community is a new style of development in which you own

your home, but lease the land it sits on. The advantage is owning a new, luxury home at an affordable price – often with reduced running costs and access to quality resort facilities.

Over-50s lifestyle resorts are designed for fully independent living. Residents also get a say in how the community is run through a Home Owners Committee.

Retirement villages are owned by companies or charities. They are frequently the first step to assisted living and nursing home arrangements, and may not be the right choice for active, independent individuals.

Swapping a house for a townhouse or apartment is another option that many people consider. Strata living often means you are sharing walls with neighbours who may not have the same values (or taste in music) as you do.

Understanding the difference between these options means you can make an informed choice.

3. Getting caught by inexperienced developers

There's more to building a vibrant over-50s lifestyle resort than just throwing up a few new houses, a swimming pool and a tennis court, then calling it a day. Quality land lease developers know that the relationship with homeowners is for the long-haul.

Because the developer continues to manage the resort after it's fully settled, an experienced developer builds with the long-term in mind.

Experience counts, so look for a developer with a proven track record of creating successful active over-50s lifestyle resorts across Australia, and who understands you and the lifestyle you want to live.

Don't risk your financial future with inexperienced land lease developers. Make sure you ask questions and ask to see completed projects so you can assess the build quality of the homes and the standard of facilities before you commit.

4. Being sold extras in your home that should be standard

Make sure you're getting true value for money.

Living Gems homes are architect-designed, 6-star energy rated homes with multiple facade and colour-scheme options. All homes are built with high-end, low maintenance living in mind and come with extensive inclusions such as high ceilings, air conditioning, solar panels, quality kitchen appliances, walk-in pantries and robes, double vanity ensuites and separate laundries, as well as thoughtfully designed storage and alfresco areas.

It is important to do your research before you sign a contract so you don't get caught paying more than you should for 'extras' that ought to be standard.

5. Being short-changed on resort facilities

Not all lifestyle resorts are created equal.

Resort facilities should be of a quality you'd expect to see at a holiday resort – thoughtfully designed with quality furniture and equipment to match.

Start by deciding what is important to you – a fully equipped gym, perhaps? A games room with billiards, a golf simulator, ten-pin bowling, or a tennis court? Perhaps you'd prefer drinks from the bar or enjoy the resort pool?

A grand ballroom is a must, along with a private cinema, cafe, crafts room, library, beauty salon and private meeting rooms.



The landscaping should be beautiful with plenty of paths and walking trails.

But in the end, the choice is personal. If you can see yourself living there, then it's worth another look and some serious consideration.

6. Being slugged by exit fees or deferred management fees

Did you know all retirement villages have exit fees when you decide to sell? These are also known as deferred management fees.

They can eat up a great deal of the capital gains your home has earned. Some people have lost tens of thousands of dollars that should have been theirs by right.

It shouldn't be this way.

Choose an active over-50s lifestyle resort that charges no exit fees and, just as importantly, offers financial transparency. At Living Gems there are no additional costs for moving in or out. Our owners are not charged stamp duty and any capital gains made are yours to keep.

The only on-going charge is a modest weekly site fee which covers the cost of on-site management as



well as running and maintaining the resort to the highest standard.

7. Ignoring options for your financial future

You've worked hard for what you've earned and a big part of that is your family home. Looking at ways to maximise your investment is a smart thing to do.

For many people it is worth unlocking the equity in a family-sized home and investing in a rightsized new home that frees capital to help you live the lifestyle you deserve in a home where the capital gains are 100 percent yours.

After spending your working life looking after other people, isn't it time to do something for you?

Does a lifestyle in which you own a home in a secure gated community with on-site management where you can simply lock up and leave to travel appeal? Or feeling that you're on holiday all day every day in a five-star resort community with plenty of like-minded people as neighbours?

If this is something that you're actively considering, we encourage you to go back to the top of the list and read it through again.

Retire from work, don't retire from life! Downsizing doesn't mean taking a step backward. Use it as an opportunity for a simply lifechanging move.

9. Putting off the decision

People tell us the same thing over and over again – they wish they'd moved into an active over-50s lifestyle resort like Living Gems a whole lot sooner.

Workshop wizards

Residents invited to explore woodworking talents

The establishment of a residents' workshop at Living Gems Caboolture Riverfront was planned as early as 2017 before it eventually opened in January 2019. Today it boasts a membership of 84, and secretary Graham Saunders, who was there from the start, couldn't be happier with the workshop's progress and popularity.

"This is something that resort residents really wanted and, with the help of a \$20,000 grant from Ruby Developments and donations of tools from generous homeowners, we were able to make it a reality," said Graham, who moved into the resort with wife Sally in 2017.

With a committee of eight, as well as two people volunteering to be in the workshop each day to ensure it can stay open for residents who want to exercise their woodworking skills on individual projects, the workshop has





become a hive of activity.

Many of its members combine their talents to voluntarily undertake resident requests for everything from ramps or steps to storage units, kitchen benches and cupboards.

"We like to help people, so we encourage them to approach us for help with many of their projects. All our labour is voluntary, so all the resident pays for are materials and a small donation to help keep the workshop viable for which we need about \$1200 turnover a year," said Graham.

The workshop is well equipped with everything from a bench saw and big band saw to sanders, handheld routers and Makita drills.

All members must pass an induction course before being able to use the tools and machinery, and there is always someone experienced on hand to help where needed.

The workshop, which is open from 10am to 4.30pm five days a week and by arrangement on weekends, welcomes men and women to join, with groups ranging from pyrography (decorating wood or other materials with burn marks) to wood carving already attracting regular attendees.

Graham's major interest is in woodturning, a hobby that has seen him create many bowls, plates, jewellery boxes, pens and more. Each year many of the products created in the workshop are sold at resort market days held in April and November.

"Last year our members made a timber hallway stand which was raffled off at the market day with proceeds divided between three groups here at the resort that struggle to get donations including the library, artistic seniors and native bees' group," said Graham.

Anyone interested in pursuing their woodworking interests are encouraged to contact Graham at the workshop to find out more and see what some of the other handy residents are creating firsthand.

Take it or leave it

Interior design tips when downsizing

Figuring out how to decorate and furnish your home when downsizing can be both exciting and daunting.

Deciding what furniture to take and how you want your new space to look and feel is one of the most fun parts of a downsizing move, but it can be overwhelming too, especially if you're coming from a large family home.

Living Gems Interior Design
Coordinator Ange Osborne has
guided dozens of residents through
the process of creating their dream
homes over the past few years. In
this month's issue of *Thrive*, she
shares her top interior design tips to
minimise the pain and maximise the
pleasure of a downsizing move.

Take what you love

If you really love it, take it with you. Special objects or pieces of furniture can be worked into a larger interior design scheme.

"People think they must get rid of everything and start from scratch, but that's not the case. If you have a piece that you love – something that has meaning and has been part of your life for a long time – you can always make it work," said Ange. "Even if you're looking at creating a completely different look at your modern Living Gems home, traditional or quirky pieces can 100 percent be blended within a contemporary space."

Measure it

Measure the width and depth of all pieces of furniture that you're thinking about taking to your new home.

"See how the pieces fit within your new floorplan to help you make the final decision about what to take or what to sell or give away," Ange said.

Over-sized furniture

Oversized furniture which may have worked in a larger family home can dwarf and dominate a smaller footprint. Unless a piece has significant sentimental value, consider selling oversized furniture.

"Give it away, or better still, sell it and save the money for buying new pieces that will work better with your new space and the interior design vision you want to create," Ange said.

Interior look and feel

Downsizing offers a great opportunity to create a fresh look and feel for your new home and lifestyle.

Ange recommends scrapbooking or using an app like Pinterest to create a mood board for an overarching aesthetic.

"You can then buy pieces that fit in with your vision, or Living Gems' interior design team can assist with a consultation or with furniture packages if shopping isn't your thing."

Focus on the living area

Living areas are where most people spend the bulk of their time, therefore it is essential to have comfortable armchairs and lounges.

"Living areas usually focus around the television, so make sure you have good quality and comfy seating," said Ange.



Try before you buy a new bed

More than once, Ange has seen Living Gems homeowners buy new beds for their homes, only to discover they aren't comfortable.

"Always try a bed before buying – always, always! They're not an inexpensive purchase and because we all spend a lot of time in our beds, it's really important to test them out," she said.

Wardrobe spring clean

Go through your wardrobe and get rid of anything you haven't worn for a long time.


Ange suggests giving away or selling pieces of clothing that have remained unworn for two years or more.

"Chances are you will never wear these pieces. Moving house is a great opportunity to strip back your wardrobe to the things you love to wear, plus it makes it easier to find things in your new home."

Editing your existing furniture and furnishings and buying new items can be challenging, but, armed with these expert tips, you can streamline the process and enjoy the ride.

Preparing for the big shift

How to organise your downsizing move

Benjamin Franklin once observed that every minute spent organising is an hour earned, so we have some great tips that will help you prepare for the move to your new Living Gems home!

Will it all fit?

Remember when you moved out of home and had only the basics? Start with a thought exercise – what pieces of furniture do you really need? Consider your new life at Living Gems and the life you want to



lead, then consider how much you need to bring with you (goodbye to all that fitness equipment!).

Delve into decluttering

Once you start opening the cupboards and drawers you might be surprised (and alarmed) by how much stuff you've accumulated over the years.

Take the opportunity to rid your

home of clutter and discover the things you really treasure.

Organisation experts recommend starting with the contents of one room that you're not emotionally attached to – this could be the garage or the kitchen.

Start by throwing away anything that is broken or at the end of its useful life.

Next, identify all the double ups - who needs three can openers and four potato peelers?! Create a sell or donate pile. In the case of garage and shed tools, you might find they have a new lease of life in the Living Gems residents' workshop.

Once you've worked your way through each room, decluttering as you go, create a project plan for packing.

Boxing clever

Your project plan should consist of a master list in which every box is numbered with a note about its contents.

Start by putting away items you're not likely to use for the next three to six months – for example Christmas decorations when it's July or winter clothing in December. Then pack in stages so the most important items used daily are packed last.

Assign each room in your new home a colour. When each box is packed, tape a matching coloured A4 sheet onto the box with the number and the room name printed on it. This makes it easier for the removalists (or helpful family and friends) to quickly put boxes in the right rooms to make unpacking easier.

When you arrive at your new home, check off each box from your master list to make sure nothing is missing.

Today everyone carries a camera on their mobile phone (and many of the younger generation are all too ready to photograph every occasion – including lunch).


While it's lovely to sit down with your family, open the photo albums, and remember those special occasions, there are some very real advantages in turning those photographs into electronic media.

Do you enjoy crafts and scrapbooking? A new print of an old photograph can be used in scrapbooking or turned into a personalised birthday or anniversary card.


What about video?

Anywhere up to 20 people meet in Ruby's arts and craft studio where they work on longer form stories, flash fiction, poems and more. The group has been running for five years, and the 200th homework assignment has just been issued.

"We all have our areas of writing interest," said convenor Francie Goodie. "I enjoy writing science fiction stories. We've had other members who've written steamy romances, and a current member's go-to is zombie stories."

Including poets, novelists, memoirists and more, the Quills are open to writers of all levels of experience.



"Not everyone has a desire to be a published author," she says. "All that's required to join our group is the desire to write."

The homework assignments that end each meeting are writing prompts which could be a phrase, such as 'Congratulations, you've been selected...' or a single word, 'switch'. The following week the writers share the resulting work which could be poetry, fiction, or a story based on personal experience.

And that's the very point of the group, as one of the writers, Terry Hayes, points out.

"With the exception of a few sad little



poems, I've never written anything before this time. As a young bloke, living and working far from home, I rarely wrote letters," he says. "At Living Gems there are plenty of sports and activities to exercise the body; what Quills does is exercise the mind."

And that's a common comment made by everyone who attended the meeting we recently visited.

"The two hours of mental activity once a week is illuminating," said Maddie Harris. "Not only is my brain getting a workout, but my sense of humour also. The atmosphere is one of hilarity and joy."

The group has adopted the Fight Club motto: 'What happens at Quills, stays at Quills'. It is a judgement-free zone that lets writers explore ideas and express what's on their mind. And every writing prompt results in something either fascinating, poignant, or downright hilarious from each writer.

Those homework assignments are regularly turned into anthologies that the group publishes and makes available to all residents at Ruby by Living Gems.

"Everyone receives a lot of encouragement and some of our members have been encouraged to submit stories to writing competitions. We've had a couple of writers here who have published memoirs," said Francie.

Quills at Ruby by Living Gems is always open to new members, and Francie is more than pleased to share information on how she runs the group to other Living Gems resorts who'd like to start their own Quills.

Strictly ballroom

Take more chances, dance more dances!

It's been 30 years since Baz Luhrmann's Australian masterpiece *Strictly Ballroom* first hit the big screen. Debuting on 10 May, 1992, and reaching US on shores 12 February, 1993, this iconic film was digitally restored last year by the National Film and Sound Archive for a special screening at the 75th Cannes Film Festival.

We spoke to our very own 'strictly ballroom' couple this month, Jim and Sue Thorpe from Living Gems Caboolture Riverfront, about the magic of dance.

Jim and Sue have been dancing together for over 55 years and cannot ever imagine stopping.

"We've been married 52 years. We actually met 55 years ago at a dance in Ballarat, so we've been dancing since..." Sue pauses.

"Since the 28th of September 1968 to be exact," Jim finishes for her.

"We do what is called social ballroom, old time and new vogue dancing, or sequence dancing, and go to lots of theme nights at our dance club throughout the year," Jim tells us.

"We have a ball on at times where we get all tizzied-up on special occasions like Christmas, Easter, and recently Australia Day.

Sometimes we even have what is called bad-taste nights which are a lot of fun, but still formal, and they do a lot of different themes," says Sue.

The couple dance at many clubs around the area and even hit the resort's Country Club dancefloor.



"Most of the halls in the area have a dance on from time to time. Wednesday night we go to the over-40s dance club which is in Redcliffe – that's been operating for over 40 years," Sue says.

"We get to dance to a regular live band and have about four or five bands that rotate over the month, so we mostly dance to live music and are very lucky to be able to do that because most parts of Australia dance to pre-recorded music, and it's not the same," says Jim passionately.

They did slow down a bit while raising their children, but were straight back into regular dancing up to four times a week once the kids left home.

"Once the last one moved out in 1995, we decided to really get back into dancing again. We've lived in Port Headland, WA, Autumn, VIC and Orange, NSW, and were in dance clubs in all of those. Now we are here and dance at every club we can," Jim says proudly.

"We dance in places like the Glass House Mountains, Upper Caboolture, Kilcoy, Sunshine Coast, Bribie Islandthe list goes on. The tempo we dance to is the waltz, foxtrot and quickstep, and Latin dancing like the salsa. It depends on what the band plays, but we dance sets to a sequence with



"We really embraced the health benefits of dancing. It's fantastic for our balance, and our doctor keeps telling us that all the time. We are both very fit, and socially it's fabulous because you can't think about anything else while you are dancing. You're just having a really good time with lots of friends," says Sue.

And what was their favourite dance in the original film?

"We watched it together 30 years ago and loved it all, especially the 'paso doble' dance," she said.

"We, of course, don't fling our arms up all over the place like that though.

If we did, we'd injure people," Jim added with a laugh.

They both describe what it feels like when they're dancing.

"Dancing makes me feel invigorated and happy. I tell people to absolutely go for it because it's fantastic for your fitness," Sue says.

"I'm in my dance world, which is another place on this planet, and there is simply nothing better to do than move in time with good music," Jim adds.

"You've got to remember to dance like no one is watching," Jim and Sue end this sentence in perfect sync.

About the Paso Doble

Originally a fast-paced Spanish military march used by troops to help with training. With a tempo of 120 steps per minute, the Paso Doble was converted into a modern Spanish dance that is often played during bullfighting, with the dance mirroring a bullfight itself.

"It's much like *Strictly Ballroom*, as you do a routine and might have to do that routine five to seven times for example, so it keeps you very fit."

Sunshine Coast dreaming

Collectively they're known as the Glass House Mountains – reminding Captain James Cook of the distinctly-shaped glass house kilns that dominated the skyline in his native Yorkshire. But to the Jinibara and Kabi Kabi people of the Sunshine Coast region, these volcanic features hold a deeper significance.

Mt Beerwah, called 'Bi awa' or Eagle, is the largest of the 12 mountains at 556 metres. She is considered the mother of the mountains. Her husband is Tibrogargan which is the next highest peak at 364 metres.

Dreamtime legend has it that Tibrogargan saw the sea level rise and ordered his son to take his mother to safety. However, the son was afraid and ran away. Angered by his son's disobedience, Tibrogargan broke the boy's neck and turned his back on the lad. From then on, the mountain was called Coonowrin which means 'crook neck'. And it is one of the most recognisable of the major peaks.

The mountains themselves are fabulous examples of volcanic plugs made of rhyolite and trachyte, ancient reminders of South East Queensland's violent geological past.

Other mountains in the range in order of height are:

- Mount Tunbubudla, the twins (338m and 294m)
- Mount Ninderry (306m)
- Mount Ngungun (253m)
- Mount Coochin (235m)
- Mount Tibberoowuccum (220m)
- Mount Coolum (208m)
- Wild Horse Mountain (123m)
- Mount Miketeebumulgrai (199m)
- Mount Elimbah (109m)

Following European settlement, the iconic mountains were a beacon for explorers and eventually settlers.

The township of Glass House Mountains became home to a Cobb & Co trading stop (featured in the last edition of *Thrive*) and the railway came to the region in 1890.

Areas around the mountains became a national park in 1997 and was expanded in 2010. In 2007, the Glass House Mountains was listed on the Queensland Heritage Register to be protected.

While many of these mountains are popular with climbers, it is requested that people refrain from doing so out of respect to the Indigenous people.



Talented Chef Matt Conquest shares a braised beef cheeks recipe infused with incredible flavours heightened by the process of slow cooking.



Ingredients Serves 2

2 whole beef cheeks or 1 large beef cheek cut into half

2 carrots

1 small sweet potato

4 small shallots/golden onions

Dry ingredients:

2 tsp sea salt

1/2 tsp black pepper

1tsp onion powder

1 tsp garlic powder

1 tsp smoked paprika

½ tsp ground cumin

Paste:

1 tbsp gravy mix or corn flour

Method

- Turn on your slow cooker to the low setting. Mix all the dry ingredients together in a bowl.
- Trim off any excess fat or sinew around the beef and place it into the slow cooker. Sprinkle both sides of the beef cheeks with dry spices.
- 3. Cut the carrots and sweet potato while leaving the onions whole. Place all the vegetables into the slow cooker alongside the beef cheeks and sprinkle some dry spices onto them.
- 4. Add half a cup of water to the pot, cover with the lid, and cook on the low setting for 8 hours.
- 5. After 8 hours, add 1 tbsp of water to the gravy mix or corn flour to make a paste. Pour and mix the paste onto the beef cheeks and vegetables.
- 6. Turn the slow cooker setting to high and cook for 30 minutes or until the sauce thickens.

Plate up and enjoy!
